Scarborough Women's Centre is founded.

### 1988

The English conversation volunteer tutoring program is founded.

#### 1987

We established Women of Many Cultures Planning Group – to work with community partners on newcomer women's issues.

#### 1989

The Women in transition volunteer mentoring program is launched.

# 1989-1991

The first major project of the Scarborough Women's Centre is completed, a safety audit of the Toronto Transit Commission resulting in the Request Stop program.

#### 1997

We launched Rebuilding Our Lives: Economic self sufficiency project to promote economic and emotional independence for woman at risk of returning to abuse.

#### 1994

A one-on-one mentorship program is launched promoting women supporting each other.

#### 1999

We helped launch the Women's Place Interagency Storefront at Morningside Mall.

#### 2000

We established our free counselling program.

#### 2007

We formed a partnership with MCIS to provide interpretation services for newcomer women using our counselling service.

#### 2004

We launched a mothers and children at-risk project for women parenting children with disabilities, at risk of returning to abusive situations.

### 2009

We launched Expanding the Reach, a program for women with disabilities.

### 2010

We launched of Building Strong Futures, a young women's outreach program focused on the capacity building of women and girls aged 13-19 years old.

# 2017

As part of Expanding the Reach, we launched a project supporting the economic empowerment for women with disabilities.
